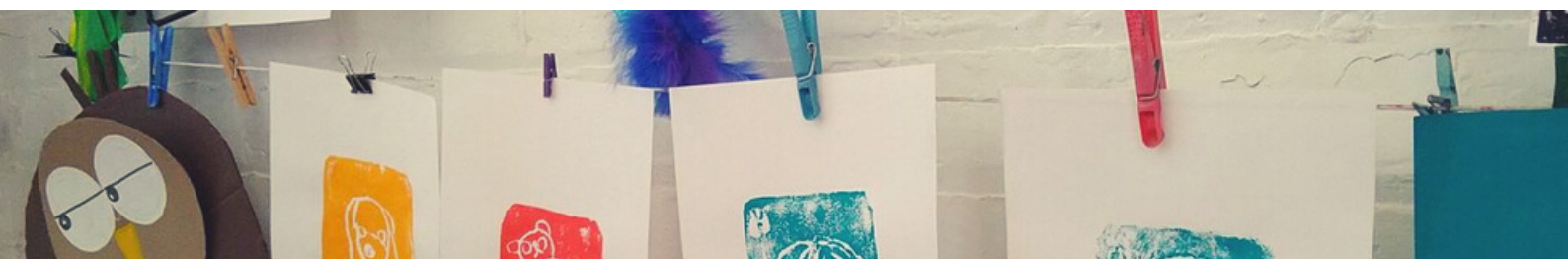


THE HISTORY OF PADDINGTON SUBSTATION

Cook's Hill was "beautified" around the turn of the century. On the left up the hill you can see the Ithaca Volunteer Fire brigade building, when it was single story and had horse stables out the back. Cook's Hill is the spot where the Ithaca War Memorial gardens are and the walking path that takes pedestrians from Enoggera Tce through to Latrobe Tce.

The NOW shot shows, in the foreground, the former tramway substation, now called The Paddington Substation and home to Hands on Art.

The heritage listed substation was built in 1929 and was operating by 1930. The substation received 11000 volts AC electricity from the New Farm Power station, via an underground feeder cable. The transformer reduced this supply, which the rotary converter then converted to 600 volts DC for the tramways network. The substation remained in service until the phasing out of Brisbane's trams in the late 1960s. In 1969 the Paddington line was closed, the substation's electrical equipment was removed, and the building became a storage depot and subsequently an art gallery.
